The first four feasts of the Bible, Passover through Shavuot, occur in the Spring. They typify our salvation in Messiah Yeshua (I Corinthians 5:7). The number seven indicates completion. That leaves us with the three fall feasts which are yet to be fulfilled in the life and work of the Messiah.
